"My personal passion is to see a visual and performing arts venue built in Arlington that includes a gallery in its lobby showcasing local artists' work, studio space for performing and visual arts classes, and a black box theater with a non-stop schedule of productions from independent theater companies and local musicians," Barker explained. "I also aim to work on affordable artist housing so more artists can both work and lie in our community," Barker expounded.
